"I graduated from Kansas State University with a MS and PhD in Family Science specializing in Family Life Education and Consultation in 2003 and 2007, respectively. I also hold a MS in Community/Public Health Nursing- Clinical Nurse Specialist from Wright State University and an American Nurses Credentialing Center Certification in the same area as an Advanced Public Health Nurse (PHNA-BC). This past Summer 2017, I was awarded the Carnegie African Diaspora Fellowship to work in Tanzania for two months at the Muhimbili University of Health and Allied Sciences (MUHAS) on a study abroad capacity building project and a NIH research collaboration project proposal on family focused interventions and Breast Cancer.

I have taught family nursing and community/public health nursing to traditional nursing students for 7 years. I have also taught and directed a study abroad global health service-learning course to Tanzania for the last 4 years.
